3. Judging starts at 10:00 a.m. Friday, August 12. The building will be open to the public at 10:00 a.m.
4. Exhibits confined to residents of Elgin County.
5. Containers supplied.
6. Must be quantity stated in prize list.
7. Please note that no two persons from the same family operation will be allowed more than one entry per section. An exhibitor may enter in one or more sections in each class.
8. Exhibits must remain until 7:00 p.m. Sunday, August 14.
9. Winners of trophies will receive their trophies during Saturday evening entertainment in front of grandstand. The Aylmer Fair Board will contact all recipients Friday, after the judging is complete. If unable to attend, recipient is responsible for designating a person to receive the award.
10. Judge's discretion is final on place standings.

2. Special Uses of a Variety of Vegetables and/or Fruits. Both raw and preserved should be included. No commercial preserved products allowed. Points awarded for the attractiveness of the display with colour, variety of kinds and variety of uses to be considered. Products and uses must be labeled. Judge must consider the exhibit worthy of a prize.

Tables will be provided.

Commercial packages, grades, varieties of fruit, and any fruit products used in connection with the display are to be neatly and correctly named. Grower's name should be prominently displayed.

Exhibits must be placed by noon, Friday, August 12, 2011.
